INTRODUCING AND SHARING OUR NATIONAL FESTIVALS

ŞEHİT MAHMUT ÖZDEMİR PRIMARY SCHOOL

Our organisation is the coordinator in this project and located in Ankara, capital of Turkey. It's a primary school in the northern part of the city. There are about 1600 students and these students are aged between 5-14. Our school has got one main block based on three floors which has a Science lab, a computer lab and 21 classrooms and etc. We are 56 teachers. Our second language is English. As our region is a suburb; the economical, educational and cultural level is very low. Especially it is a migration area from its and another cities/villages. In different social occasions, there is social exclusion for these area's people, also for students.

PRIMARY SCHOOL № 2 IN PRUSZKÓW, POLAND

The school was opened on 3rd September 1984. It is named after Kornel Makuszyński, a famous Polish author of children's books. The total area of school is 6800m². It has got three floors and there are 25 classrooms, a library, two computer rooms, a gym, a canteen and a TV studio. Outside, there is a large playground, a football pitch and a basketball court. In the school year 2012/2013 there are 65 teachers and 776 students. Apart from Polish, Maths, Science and History pupils also study English, Religion, Art, Music, Crafts and IT. All the students learn to play musical instruments and many of them sing in the school choir. They are successful in sports, too. The students have their own government so that they can influence their school life. They also publish a school magazine „Our 2”. The pupils also prepare „The school news” which is broadcast on the school TV.

CHRISTIAN MORGENSTERN VOLKSSCHULE

About 620 pupils are visiting Christian-Morgenstern-Volksschule Herrsching. There is a primary and a secondary school. The pupils are between six and 17 years old. They are attending 27 different classes. About 50 teachers are working at our school. It has got a kitchen for the cooking classes, a library, two computer rooms, an arts and crafts room, two special rooms for teaching physics and chemistry, two gyms, a teachers room, three playgrounds and a canteen. When the pupils have finished grade four they have the options to change to a grammar school. The school is named after the German poet Christian Morgenstern, who lived at lake Ammersee. The village "Herrsching" is very close to lake Ammersee.

6° CIRCOLO DIDATTICO "R. LAMBRUSCHINI"

The town of Perugia has got eleven "Circoli Didattici"; our schools belong to the "6° Circolo Didattico" that is one of the biggest of it. It's made up by many blocks: six Primary schools (pupils from 6 to 10 years old) and five Infant Schools (pupils from 3 to 5). All the schools of this "Circolo Didattico" are located in suburban zones not far away from the town centre, Perugia. There are about 1200 pupils and 90 teachers (the majority are women). The students belong to the middle class and there are also many foreign pupils, mainly from East-European countries and North Africa.
